Transportation Hours of Service - Lori Janz

Road transportation logistics can be complicated, and regulatory restrictions on the hours that truck drivers can work are one of the main reasons.

Not only drivers, but dispatchers, shippers, logistics coordinators, customer service reps, purchasers, and supply-chain managers all need to understand the time factors involved in moving goods by truck. Lori's presentation simplifies the basics of North American hours of service regulations and relates them to the people requiring a product to move, the people moving the product, and the people waiting for the product to arrive. It's the focus on the word "people" that makes this presentation different from standard logbook training, shifting the spotlight on what we really need to understand about highway hours of service.
